Atlanta Restoration Professional to be Featured at International Conference

Smyrna, GA- August 2, 2011 – Restore All Inc., a full service disaster restoration and remediation company, is pleased to announce that our Vice President of Operations, Mark McLaughlin, has been chosen out of hundreds of applicants to present at the 6th International Scientific Conference on Bioaerosols, Fungi, Bacteria, Mycotoxins in Indoor and Outdoor Environments and Human Health on September 6-9, 2011 in Saratoga Springs, N.Y.

Mr. McLaughlin will be presenting his abstract, "Mold Remediation According to the Standard of Care: Does It Work, Is It Worth It? ".

Mr. McLaughlin developed this abstract from his thesis and research that earned him the Certified Mold Professional (CMP) designation earlier this year. Mr. McLaughlin built four identical rooms, contaminated them with mold growth and then used various remediation techniques in each room. He took multiple samples in order to determine if following the industry standard of care really makes a difference during mold remediation. From this extensive study, Mr. McLaughlin determined that following the New York City guidelines, EPA recommendations, and OSHA suggestions for handling small amounts of mold (less than 10 ft.²) can put people at significant risk because the right engineering controls and protections aren't being used. His startling discoveries went through extensive peer and professional review before being awarded this high level certification.

The 6th International Scientific Conference on Bioaerosols, Fungi, Bacteria, Mycotoxins in Indoor and Outdoor Environments and Human Health will address state of the art research and practical experience to improve the understanding of microbials (bacteria, mold, bio- and mycotoxins), determine important agents and diagnosis of adverse human health effects, as well as explore new treatment approaches, and the control and prevention of such exposure. Scientific advances, knowledge gaps and future research priorities will be discussed. This conference will connect internationally-recognized researchers and leading investigators with "front line" practitioners and consultants addressing "real world" problems. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Mycotoxin Research Association of Germany and the South African Department of Occupational and Environmental Health are among the conference presenters.

"I am honored to have been chosen for this opportunity," said Mr. McLaughlin. "It is great to perform research that you know benefits you and your clients, but when the scientific community recognizes its importance as well, it's very affirming. I will be speaking to a large group of medical doctors, environment and scientific PHD's and other industry colleagues. I look forward to the event and I hope to shed some light on proper mold remediation and the consequences of doing it poorly. This will be the first time that anyone has spoken at a conference of this magnitude and publically challenged the New York City Guidelines on mold remediation as well as the OSHA and EPA standards."
